

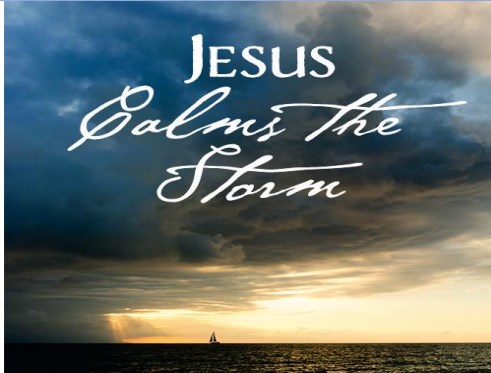

From the Vicar

During my teenager years, I lived on the shores of Lake Jindabyne in NSW. A bit like Queenstown but not as close to the snow. The water in Lake Jindabyne is never warm and if you want to swim in it, one must stay on the surface. However, it is brilliant for sailing and canoeing.

One year my sister and I took the new canoe out onto the lake. In our excitement of the first launch we hadn't checked the weather. We had only been on the water for 30 minutes, time to get into the middle of one of the bays, before the wind began to blow so strongly we were being swamped and couldn't turn the canoe. The weight of the water and the waves were making it impossible to move. We had our life jackets and the canoe had bouncy, but it had gotten to a point where we needed rescuing. I really don't remember how long we were out on the water but fortunately someone noticed we had been unable to get to shore and came to rescue us with a speed boat. We had to bail out the canoe before it could be dragged through the choppy water and taken back onto dry land.

The disciples knew that nothing was going to save them in their time of need. The prospect of drowning was very real and in their heightened fear, they saw what they believed to be a ghost, a Spector that would take them to Hades. Christ came to them and declared his sovereignty over the elements. But this rescue pales into insignificance compared to the one bought with his death and resurrection. The Creator holds all things wild and calm, broken and whole. Trust in Jesus, the one who stilled the storm.
