From the Vicar

Jesus sent his disciples out on a number of occasions to proclaim the kingdom of God, but what does that mean?

We are told they were able to perform miracles but we really don't know what they said.

The disciples had been walking and learning about Jesus but weren't entirely sure of who he actually was. There was no Bible, no crucifixion, no resurrection or church tradition. What they did know was that God is powerful and interested in a relationship with everyone, and that social and religious status are not indicators of worth or authority.

During their times out in the mission field the disciples faced challenges with conviction and success. Things looked fairly simple and straightforward. "God is with us", "He cares about us" and "He will cause His kingdom to be manifest on earth."

These messages are still true today. Through Christ's death our frailty and weakness are not held against us but used as examples of God's mercy and salvation.

Are you prepared to live in faith and proclaim the gospel? The world still needs each one of us to share in the knowledge of the love of God.
