From the Vicar

The church is looking beautiful today and there remains an air of comfort. We had over 50 people attend the Anglo-Catholic Hui yesterday. People of different ages and walks of life came together to learn more about faith and worship.

I learnt that Our Lady of Walsingham has an ancient past. Beginning in the 1061 a noble woman had three visions of Mary the mother of Jesus, insisting that the room in Nazareth be built to encourage pilgrims meditate on the space and ask themselves can they say yes to God. The Saxon noble woman, Richeldis de Faverches built the Holy House and for another 500 years pilgrims visited. I encourage you to learn more of this remarkable venture. This challenge was presented again amongst all the pilgrims who came to St Peter's. But we also need to ponder that question, can we say yes to God.
