

From the Vicar

This week has been full of debate. First The Debate in America between Harris and Trump, and then the debates we had at synod.

The idea of presenting your ideas and understanding, should be encouraged with one caveat. Does what is being said, build on positive understanding or does it create division? We are often blind to our own short comings, but quick to point out those of others. This behaviour is reflected in what we say and how we behave. We are a result of a life time of experiences, social expectations and natural traits. What we desire is probably very similar to that of our neighbour but do we take into account our neighbours desires? Or do our desires actively diminish our neighbour.

Jesus wants each one of us to look more closely at what we want and how we go about getting it.

Jesus Christ as the Son of God, asks that we turn from our person desires and look toward the trust Jesus had in his Father. A holy and eternal life is not obtained through power, wealth or wisdom obtained through our own efforts. It is gained through faith in Jesus Christ's example of humility and trust in a redemptive God.
