

You may have noticed that the holly at the eastern end of the church is now horizontal. Some wonderful volunteers have helped remove the diseased and potentially dangerous tree to open up the space and show the world we're still here. The timber will be mulched and used in our gardens.

The lowering of the hedge and removal of a few sick trees, the regular garden and lawn maintenance and the removal of moss and mould signifies to those who go past that St Peter's is a place of heritage, beauty and peace.

Thank you to those who have invested time and energy, sweat and finance to tidy up St Peter's.

More work needs to be done and this will require some excavations around the church and Vicarage. It wont look pretty but it will ultimately solve our drainage problems, corroding brick work and flaking paint. A similar project happened at All Saints a number of years ago.

I am hoping to hold an extra-ordinary meeting near the end of October to bring everyone up to date of what has been achieved and what is planned. These plans will require careful thought and consideration as they will require time and money. I believe it is important that we are in agreement before the next phase is actioned.
